Fresh Air: We love fresh air, and it is good to open some windows in the church, at least for a few hours each day. However, it is also good to close them again in the mid afternoon, to keep whatever warm air in, and to stop the chill winter winds from blowing through. If you are in the church in the afternoon, please lend a hand by closing whatever windows you can.

Lights: It's wonderful that people come to pray in our church at all hours of the day. However, for safety it is important that there be some lights on in the evenings. If you are in the church in the mid afternoon and have a key to the sacristy, please put a few (not all) lights on in readiness for people to come and pray in the evening. And even if you don't have a key, there is a light switch near the front left hand side of the nave of the church, and also in the foyer.

Carparking in Church & School Grounds

Just a reminder that when coming to mass each weekend the church and school grounds are open for you to park in while you attend mass. Once mass is over, you must move your car if you are planning on staying in Chatswood. **The gates will be locked ½ hour after the 5.30pm Saturday Vigil and Sunday night masses** finish i.e. 7pm. Cars still in the carpark after this time will be locked in until the next day.

Within the Parish

CHATSWOOD CATHOLIC PRECINCT

Uniquely, our location in the heart of Chatswood provides our Parish with significant opportunities during the next decade for the redevelopment of our Parish and Catholic Schools site. While presenting challenges, it also provides the prospect to re-imagine our Parish for the future, ensuring the sustainability of our vibrant community for the years to come.

A working party representing the Parish, Our Lady of Dolours School, Mercy College and St Pius X College has been formed to investigate this opportunity which will allow us to develop the facilities we need for the parish and the schools to flourish in the 21st Century. Parishioners Paul Taqueban and Andrew Wilson will represent the parish along with me. This is a long-term project, right at the beginning of its life. While our church building certainly could not be moved, redevelopment could include any of the other school & parish buildings.

I assure you that significant parishioner consultation will be undertaken at every step of the way to ensure your hopes and aspirations for our Parish community are captured and considered. Prior to any decisions being made our community's vision for the Parish and all our church and school requirements will all be taken into the discernment process, each step of the way.

To commence this process with you, our first task is to discern what kind of Parish we wish to be, so that our mission can define the facilities – rather than the facilities of the past constraining and defining our mission. What do we dream for our Parish 20 years, 50 years, 100 years in the future? What can our Parish become? How can it be a sign of the Good News of Jesus in our neighbourhood and city in the future? What do you think we need? What meeting spaces, prayer spaces, open space, parking and access etc? I invite you to reflect on this prayerfully and discuss this with the groups and ministries to which you belong.

In due course, our responses to these questions will be incorporated into a Needs Assessment Brief. Obviously, much discussion and work will need to take place to see if all “ingredients” of the brief are viable but I want to ensure, as much as possible, everyone will be consulted to guide this process to a point of decision making.

I very much look forward to taking this journey with you, knowing there will be a shared interest, concern and strong desire to sustain our wonderful Parish well into the future.

I am away from the parish on study leave from May 28th to August 20th. I invite you to make your recommendations to me in writing at the Parish Office or PO Box 1446 Chatswood 2057 during this time so that when I return I can begin a process of discernment with you, the wider parish and the school communities. *Fr Jim*

HELLO FROM OMAHA: As you read this I will be on retreat at Griswold, on the border of Iowa and Nebraska, with miles of cornfields in every direction. As a final year student, I will be helping to lead and give spiritual direction to the first year students, as I was myself two years ago. It is an eight day silent retreat, with strict silence including at meals, with no phones, computers or TV. The only exception to the silence is daily Mass, and a daily spiritual direction conversation, but even these take on a quieter, more contemplative tone as we enter into deeper silence each day. 'Rejoice and be glad' "This holiness to which the Lord calls you will grow through small gestures. Here is an example: a woman goes shopping, she meets a neighbour and they begin to speak, and the gossip starts. But she says in her heart: "No, I will not speak badly of anyone". This is a step forward in holiness. Later, at home, one of her children wants to talk to her about his hopes and dreams, and even though she is tired, she sits down and listens with patience and love. That is another sacrifice that brings holiness. Later she experiences some anxiety, but recalling the love of the Virgin Mary, she takes her rosary and prays with faith. Yet another path of holiness. Later still, she goes out onto the street, encounters a poor person and stops to say a kind word to him. *One more step.*" (GE, 16)

REJOICE AND BE GLAD! These books have arrived in the Piety Stall. You can purchase a copy for \$10. *Rejoice and Be Glad*, or *Gaudete et Exsultate* (its official Latin name) is a short, wonderfully readable call to holiness for all people. Pope Francis makes reference to some of the great canonised saints of our Church, but then invites us to look at *the saints next door* – the ordinary people who achieve holiness through marriage, parenthood, and generosity in community life.

As we celebrate Corpus Christi today inspired by Christ’s sacrifice, as the youth of Chatswood Parish we seek to live our lives in the JOY that he has called us to, In Communion with Him!

Our time with the Broken Bay Year of Youth Pilgrimage Cross in early May was special for the Youth of Chatswood ... and it is visiting us again!

Our next week **hosting the Cross as it travels around the Diocese will be later this month from the 23rd to the 30th of June.** This will again be a significant time for our youth community with special events to celebrate, inform and encourage our faith. It will be about drawing us together in fellowship at this peak time in the local celebration of the Year of Youth.

The Pilgrimage Cross will again be present at all Masses on the weekend of the 23rd and 24th of June during which we will pray for our youth.

The St Pius X College Assembly on the 25th of June will be an opportunity for the students to engage with the message of Joy which the Cross brings as it travels around our schools and parishes.

Our Relationship discussion; **‘Becoming the One’** (also entitled ‘How not to end up on Married at First Sight’) began in May and attracted a number of young adults interested in exploring this important area of our lives and faith. We are continuing this event aimed at those **16 years of age and older on Tuesday the 26th of June from 7pm in the Bishop Barry Room.** On this occasion we will be joined by members of The Culture Project Australia. The Culture Project is an initiative of young people living in mission for 12 months and spreading a message through schools, parishes and youth groups of human dignity and sexual integrity, promoting a Culture of Life in the contemporary world. Our discussion will again focus on the message that we are all worthy of authentic love. Please join us for an open and honest discussion about a positive approach to love and relationships aligned with Gospel Values and set against the contemporary secular approach to this most important facet of our lives.

On Friday the 29th of June we will be holding a praise and worship event in the church; this will be a creative night full of music, worship and fun. Collaborating with our local Catholic schools and neighbouring parishes the event will be a youthful celebration. This P&W night is open to all the youth of the parish and we would love to welcome you to join in the JOY.

On Saturday the 30th collaborating with the youth from the Lower North Shore parish we will walk the Year of Youth Cross in pilgrimage to St.

Thomas’s on High Street in Willoughby. We will then hold some activities with the joint youth groups.

As a parish and throughout our student community we are looking forward to taking a very large contingent of youth aged 16-30 to the **Australian Catholic Youth Festival in Perth December 2019.**

A few of our young adults benefited greatly over the past month or so from Fr Jim’s Ignatian Spirituality Course. The teachings gave an increased insight into a meaningful prayer life and a real relationship with Jesus. We will pray for Fr Jim whilst he is on sabbatical and look forward to his learnt wisdom enriching our spiritual journeys upon his return.

Two weeks ago we were fortunate to take a number of our local students to **The Shine Conference at St. Peter’s Tuggerah.** We joined in with around 300 others from all around the Diocese in a formative and uplifting event. Plenaries and workshops on topics such as servant leadership, dramatic art in youth ministry supplemented an address and Q&A with Bishop Peter and musical entertainment and storytelling from the internationally acclaimed Steve Angrisano. It was an amazing event. Our youth left full of hope receiving a message of Joy in Jesus inspired to “Give God a shot” knowing that only when they let their light shine can they truly have a chance to change the world.

The Youth of Chatswood will be joining the conversation leading us to Plenary Council 2020. In the coming months we will appoint a youth animator from within our ranks to lead our young through conversation to discover and discern, with the guidance of the Holy Spirit, the future course for the church of Australia. Focused on the question; **what do you think God is asking of us at this time?**

SOCIAL JUSTICE MATTERS

Maubara Orphanage:

There was a great spirit of parish community at the recent barbecue run by the Social Justice ministry a few weeks ago. \$2174 was raised for the Maubara Orphanage. This amount will pay the fees for one of the four girls we are funding to undertake her tertiary studies. We cooked over 900 sausages and there was a lot of grease but we were thrilled with the outcome and our fabulous team of workers had fun in the process.

Laudato Si

Many of you will be aware of Sophia's petition calling for a ban on single-use and heavy retail plastic bags. Sophia is a student at Monte' Sant Angelo and inspired by Pope Francis's encyclical Laudato Si she is seeking community support for this ban. We are asking you to sign Sophia's petition that asks the Legislative Assembly to introduce legislation to stop the use of single-use plastic bags at retail points of sale in NSW. Some facts to ponder are:

* NSW consumes 34% of Australia's 8.5 billion plastic bag produced each year and require vast amounts of fossil fuels to produce them, adding greatly to greenhouse emissions

*The promise of some supermarkets to phase out the use of single use plastic bags is voluntary and cannot be enforced

* If usage continues at its current rate it is predicted that by 2050, 95% of all species of seabirds will suffer from ingestion of plastic

*It costs the Government more than \$4million per annum to clean up litter specifically caused by Plastic bags

The petition will be available for you to sign at the entrances to the church next weekend 9/10 June

National Refugee Week

Refugee Week is Australia's peak annual activity to raise awareness about the issues affecting refugees and celebrating the positive contributions made by refugees to Australian society. In a world where refugees experience persecution in their countries of origin and often face discrimination, difficulty and rejection in places where they seek refuge, speaking out often requires courage. In refugee week we acknowledge and celebrate the dedication and bravery of refugee leaders, advocates and citizens who draw attention to violations of human rights, support people at their time of greatest need and challenge callous indifference to the suffering of others. This year we will continue to support the House of Welcome at East Granville. This organisation provides welcome and practical support to asylum seekers and refugees. The centre provides caseworkers, visa assistance, material support, skills development courses and community connection programs. We are asking you once again to donate food/basic items for distribution by the House of Welcome. These will

be collected on the weekends of 16/17 June and 23/24 June. Please add one or more of the following to your shopping list and place them into one of the containers that will be placed at the entrances to the church. (Please bring your items in a recyclable bag and take the bag home with you.) Please do not donate items that are not listed. **Cooking oil, canned tuna, chickpeas, lentils, kidney beans, canned tomatoes, flour, Basmati rice, long life milk, Cleaning products, Instant coffee, Tea (chamomile, jasmine, green, black) Dried fruit, shampoo, deodorant, shower gel/body wash, washing powder, detergent, cleaning products.**

Children's Sacramental Program 2018-2019



Now that First Communion has been celebrated for the children in our parish, our next Children's Sacramental Program will begin in Term Three.

In our parish, the Children's Sacramental Program is a process where children prepare for and receive three Sacraments; Confirmation, Reconciliation and Holy Communion. This program normally runs from July-August through to June the following year. To be eligible to enrol in this program, children must be baptised Catholic and 7 years of age (normally Year 2) or older.

An overview of the whole process will be discussed at our **Parent Information Meeting**, which will be held on **Wednesday 25 July 2018 at 7.00pm in the Church**. This meeting is especially geared for parents who have not been involved in the Children's Sacramental program in our parish before, however all parents of eligible children are warmly invited to attend this meeting.

After this meeting enrolments for the first sacrament in this process **Confirmation** will be open via our parish website.

Children's Atrium News

Our parish Atrium is up and running again this term after taking Term One off in anticipation of the building works that were to occur.

We have been delighted to welcome the children back and the children are settling in to the rhythm of the Atrium once again.



What is the Atrium?

The Atrium is the name of the room where we run a program called the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd (CGS). This is a faith formation process for children between the ages of 3 and 12 years. The central aim of this faith formation program is to enable the child to experience and form their own personal relationship with God.

The CGS is grounded in scripture and the liturgy of the church, then framed by Montessori principles of education. This allows children to hear the Gospels through the use of hands on materials. The children are free to work with these materials that represent essential proclamations of the Christian message at their own pace.

The Atrium is a place of community and worship rather than a place of academic study. It is a place to be with and enjoy God, listen to the Word and to pray. It is designed to reflect the beauty of creation and God's abiding love.

It is a very special place and one in which both the adults and children feel very blessed to belong to.

In the past 4 weeks since our return to the atrium, many of the children in the sessions have expressed their joy and thanks to God for the atrium – especially in group prayer time, which we hold at the end of each session.

The atrium is for your child too!

The Holy Spirit will give them those “Wow” moments in their lives too if they allow Him.
